Today we learned about **4d EMMA** **6a** _____ who was a civil rights leader in San Antonio during the **9d** _____ Depression of the 1930s. When she was sixteen years old, Emma joined some **8d** _____ workers in a strike for fair wages. She was active in the Workers' **2d** _____ and she also worked with the CIO, the Congress of **3d** _____ Organizations, and with the Communist Party of the USA. In 1938 she led a famous **11a** _____ shellers' strike. In 1939, a mob started a **12a** _____ outside the San Antonio Municipal Auditorium where the communist party was meeting. Emma was **black7a** _____; that is, no one would hire her to work. She moved to **10d** _____ (state, abbreviation) and went to **8a** _____ to learn to be a **5d** _____. Later, she returned to San Antonio and taught school for many years. Because she was very passionate about her work, people still remember her as *La* **1a** _____.
